# Academic Activities Research Programmes / Projects

## Envisioning the Role of MSMEs in India's Industrial Transformation: An Analysis using CGE Modelling Framework

This study sponsored by ICSSR is coordinated by Dr Akhilesh Kumar Sharma, Assistant Professor, ISID. As one of its objectives, the study has assessed the macroeconomic impact of industrial transformation in the Indian economy using a CGE Modelling Framework and the Social Accounting Matrix for India for the year 2017-18. The simulation results obtained through introducing different productivity shocks across sectors due to new technologies. Preliminary results indicate that industrial transformation has potential to significantly and positively affect key macro-economic indicators of the economy including GDP, export, import and employment besides increasing the share manufacturing in the gross value added. However, it may depress prices, wage rate and households' income. In another simulation with shocks to productivity, investment, fiscal measures and firm protection for the manufacturing sector, the research team has observed that India may reverse its deindustrialisation process and achieve a manufacturing-led growth, through a comprehensive policy mix promoting the manufacturing sector within a decade.

# Partnerships JNU Team visits ISID

A team comprising Prof Satish Chandra Garkoti, Rector, Prof P.R. Kumaraswami, and Prof Shankari Sunderaraman visited ISID on May 24, 2023. The JNU Team interacted with the Director and the faculty members of the Institute. Prof Nagesh Kumar, Director, ISID made a presentation on the work programme of ISID following which the faculty members briefed them on their research interests. The Team also visited the library, convention halls and other facilities at the campus.

## Explaining the Conundrum of Service-Led Growth in India: Changing Composition of Demand and Income Distribution

This ICSSR sponsored project coordinated by Dr Satyaki Roy, Associated Professor, ISID aims to analyse the service led growth of India in the recent past from the demand side looking into it at the macro level together with related changes in consumption expenditure patterns at the household level. Data sources including National Accounts Statistics, KLEMS Data Base, World Integrated Trade Solution Data Base for macro level trends and several rounds of NSSO Consumption Expenditure Survey and CMIE's Consumer Pyramids Household Survey (CPHS) database help in identifying changes in the household based expenditure patterns. Factors contributing to the change at the macro level have been identified and for the broad patterns of consumption expenditure at the household level the study undertakes the analyses by regions and consumption expenditure classes. At the next level using unit level data of the NSSO consumption expenditure survey of various rounds and the CPHS data more appropriate variables are constructed to understand the consumption expenditure patterns by various economic and social categories. An interim report on the progress of the project has been submitted to the ICSSR.

## Liberalisation, International Trade and Industrial Productivity: A Case Study of Organised Manufacturing Sector in India

The primary objective of this study, coordinated by Dr R. Rijesh, Assistant Professor, ISID and sponsored by ICSSR, is to assess the impact of trade on productivity by analyzing disaggregated industry-level data obtained from the Annual Survey of Industries (ASI) since liberalisation. As trade expands, the nature of specialization can shift towards industries with comparative advantages (interindustry effects) or from less efficient to more efficient plants within the same industry (intra-industry effects), which can significantly expand labour productivity. An econometric analysis of 58 cross-sectional panels covering Indian manufacturing industries from 1991 to 2018 reveals that productivity growth is primarily driven by technical change within industries with limited impact on labour reallocation between industrial sectors. The subsequent stage of the project will focus on examining the impact of trade on Total Factor Productivity (TFP) at the 3-digit level, followed by an attempt to disentangle the trade-productivity nexus at the plant level.

<u>Aligning G20 Industrial Policies with Biodiversity Conservation</u>, PBs #23-04, May 2023

Biodiversity conservation is a cross-cutting theme across all 17 of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Businesses can significantly augment global efforts to conserve biodiversity and abate biodiversity loss. Through targeted policy instruments, G20 countries can catalyse business engagement in biodiversity conservation and also bring discipline to what could otherwise morph into an unbridled pile of symbolic corporate actions. This Policy Brief proposes five specific policies that can pave the way for businesses to make a meaningful contribution to global efforts for biodiversity conservation.



Towards an Innovative Financing Mechanism for Sustainable Development: Reviving International Financial Transactions Tax (IFTT) on the G20 Agenda, PBs #23-05, June 2023

SDGs and climate action evidently require staggering amounts of external finance. The global community has found it challenging to keep the commitments on development finance. Given overstretched budgets and fiscal constraints, new and innovative sources of financing are needed. International Financial Transactions Tax (IFTT) can be a new and substantial source of revenue for climate action. New estimates made by the authors and reported in this Brief suggest that, even at a very marginal rate of 0.05%, IFTT could yield annual revenues worth US\$ 650 billion, roughly equivalent to three and a half times the annual flows of ODA. Besides resources for climate action, IFTT could also provide another global public good by helping curb the volatility and the disruptive consequences of short-term capital flows. In that context, this policy brief makes a case for reviving IFTT on the G20 Agenda of the current presidency and proposes a way forward.
